

It may be hard to get relief from the dog days of summer, but this month

shoppers may get some relief from high prices on products ranging from laptops to gardening tools, if they know where to look. "August is a relatively slow month for deals," says Kimberly Palmer, a consumer

Most of the bargains will be on end-of-season summer goods, as retailers continue clearing out inventory and floor space to make room for fall merchandise. Shoppers can also expect to see the launch of early Labor Day

sales at the end of the month. The three-day weekend starting on August 30 is an opportunity to find deals on bigger-ticket items like mattresses and appliances. There are two fun "holidays" to watch for in August. National Chocolate Chip Cookie Day falls on August 4, where you might see deals or freebies from the
