


## Where to Find It

What would a trip to Milwaukee be without a beer tour? Many local breweries offer guided tours with free beer samples, which makes for a fun afternoon. Lakefront Brewery, Sprecher Brewery and Miller Brewing Company all offer guided tours that will give your guests a touch of Milwaukee spirit. The Milwaukee Art Museum is another tourist must-see, with beautiful architecture by the world-renowned Santiago Calatrava. Discovery World Museum is an exciting destination for guests with children, as is the Milwaukee Public Museum. In Madison, Olbrich Botanical Gardens is ideal for a summer afternoon stroll, and State Street is a destination in itself. Guests at Green Bay weddings can take a tour of Lambeau Field, and if possible, catch a Packers game.



An increasing number of brides-to-be are seeking custom-made jewelry as a unique symbol of their love; individual designs can better suit one's personality and lifestyle. At Shaw's and at Rogers and Hollands, two jewelry stores found in malls throughout the state, rings can be made to order. Amy LaBelle, jewelry designer and sales associate at Shaw's Jewelers at Mayfair Mall in Wauwatosa, says she designs rings for several couples a year. "Many times, the client will have an idea of what they want, but aren't

quite sure of all the details. I sit down with them and show them some of our standard designs. Then they can pick and choose which qualities of the ring they would like for their own. It does cost a bit more to custom-design your ring, but in the end, you get exactly what you want." Whitehall Company Jewelers also offers custommade wedding bands and engagement rings. "Our rings are very unique, and often have more ornate details than other jewelers provide," manager and certified diamontologist Kevin Marcelle says. "We are also seeing more colors coming into the wedding ring, with pink and yellow

diamonds, and even sapphires and rubies." Whitehall Company has two stores in Milwaukee, at Mayfair and Southridge Malls.

There is only one store in the state, at Mayfair Mall in Wauwatosa, but brides in other parts of the state can order online at www.celebrate wisconsin.com. The Wisconsin Cheese Mart (215 W. Highland Ave., Milwaukee) also offers a wide range of gift baskets that will add a touch of Wisconsin flair for out-of-towners. Pre-made baskets and boxes are available in-store, or create your own while ordering online at www.thecheesemart.com.

Limelight Catering—Food Illuminated is a Chicago-based company that offers organic catering for weddings. Though they are based in Chicago, they have done events in Wisconsin. Hubbard St., Milwaukee, 414.374.8480) co-owns an organic farm, Cedar Creek Farm, which provides their naturally healthy produce. On both floors of the restaurant, Roots can accommodate groups of up to 200 people. In Milwaukee, Barossa Restaurant and Wine Bar (235 S. Second St., 414.272.8466) offers outstanding organic dining in an amber-lit intimate setting. For smaller weddings or rehearsal dinners, Harvest Restaurant in Madison (21 N. Pinckney St., 608.244.6075) has a private dining room available and is proud to feature locally grown, organic ingredients. Neighboring L'Etoile Restaurant (25 N. Pinckney St., 608.251.0500) also prides itself on working with local farmers to produce excellent quality organic fare.
